Appointment to Natixis executive committee

Patrick Artus has been appointed chief economist at Natixis

Patrick Artus has been appointed chief economist at Natixis and becomes a member of the executive committee. He will report to Laurent Mignon, CEO of Natixis.

Patrick Artus started his career in 1975 at INSEE (L'Institut national de la statistique et des études économiques), where his work included economic forecasting and modelisation. He then worked at the Economics Department of the OECD (1980), and subsequently became Head of Research at the ENSAE (Ecole Nationale de la Statistique et de l'Administration Economique) and Head of the Research Seminary at Paris Dauphine. In 1985, he was appointed Economic Advisor in the Research department at Banque de France. In 1988, he became Head of the Economic and Financial Research department at Caisse des Dépôts et Consignations, and then Head of ALM. In 1993 he was appointed Head of Economic Research and Head of Market Research at CDC-IXIS. Since 1998, he has been Head of Research at Natixis.

Patrick Artus teaches at various universities (Dauphine, ENSAE, Centre des Hautes Etudes de l'Armement, Ecole Nationale des Ponts et Chaussées, HEC Lausanne, etc.) and is currently Professor of Economics at University Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne.

He has written several books and is now a correspondent member of the council of economic advisors to the French Prime Minister. Patrick Artus is also a member of the Board at Total and Ipsos.

Patrick Artus is a graduate of Ecole Polytechnique, Ecole Nationale de la Statistique et de l'Administration Economique and Institut d'Etudes Politiques de Paris.
